Bar Harbor, Maine (KBHB) Hancock County Airport

Departure Saturday to Provincetown Cape Cod from KBHB Bar Harbor will be at 2 PM. There is no plan to depart as a flight but some of pilots may team up for the trip south towards Boston. Plan to arrive Provincetown KPVC by 4 PM. The city is about 3 -4 miles from the airport so again some of us will have rental cars to help shuttle folks from the airport to the hotel and there is taxi service available too. Sunday morning will be On Your Own. We will plan to meet back at the airport (KPVC) at 10 AM for our departure to New York City. The New York / Hudson River flight requires special flight rules. All pilots should complete the online training at: http://faasafety.gov/files/helpcontent/Courses/NY%20Course/index.html
There are wings credits available for the course and you can print a business card sized certificate to carry with you. Also you need to have the most current New York Terminal Area Chart and the backside of this chart has the New York TAC VFR Planning Charts. These can be downloaded in Foreflight and saved in your documents section. Go to AOPA for all the info and links:

The entire program and course is pretty simple but gives a good understanding of how the Hudson River Corridor area is controlled. All aircraft will maintain visual separation, <140 kts and at least 1-mile distance apart. The plan will be to fly south down river on the west side and make a U-turn at the VZ bridge and fly north up river on the east side. We will all land and meet at KHPN White Plains for debrief and lunch. After lunch you are On Your Own to go enjoy NYC, Manhattan, baseball game or continue your adventure as planned. Some will be turning west and heading home for work on Monday. Wherever your plans take you we will all be ready to gather again to reminisce the adventure and plan for 2015.
